

# **New Palouse Area Repeater**

Our newest KBARA repeater is up and running. The repeater was installed on June 14th on West Twin just NE of Moscow, ID. Bill, KG7SJR and his wife Jan, Chris, W0CLF, myself and Nick and Mike from our host company, First Step Internet were the install crew. We had the repeater up and running on the RF side in about two hours. We had some technical difficulties on the linking side



which is IRLP. As you are reading this we are now linked to the system with another team being Glen, K1RR, Duff, WA7BFN and Jim, WA7VFQ visiting the site got the IRLP up and running on July 19th. Jim has been spreading the word in the area about the repeater. People are very excited that there is once again KBARA coverage in the Palouse. Repeater is on 147.320, plus offset and a 103.5 hz tone.

I would like to thank everyone that was involved with getting this repeater on the air. First of all, Art, WB7AUK for the radio and fancy cooling fan and pointing out the duplexers on eBay for me. John, W7OE for the controller, Glen, K1RR for the IRLP and his technical expertise. Bill, KG7SJR for the antenna, Duff, WA7BFN for the antenna bracket, jumpers from radio to duplexers, and John Boy, KD7AAT and Jeff, KG7HZT for their financial donations that purchased the power supply, programming software and cable, Rig Runner, and other necessities. A special thanks to Jim, WA7VFQ for arranging contact with our host, First Step Internet. Kevin (owner), Nick and Mike have been great to work with.

I received my HAM license in early 2012 (March-April sometime). I had just been given a <u>calling</u> in my church (LDS) — emergency preparedness coordinator — and I was informed that such a calling required me to be HAM radio qualified. Up till then, I knew little about HAM radio. Oh, I knew HAMS were out there, I'd heard of them, and so forth and so on — but beyond this, I couldn't have cared less about them and what they did.

In the first year of my church calling, I composed an emergency preparedness manual for my church ward (congregation it's called by other churches) which was eventually approved, published, and circulated. But as yet I'd done nothing about HAM radio. Well, finally, a church-sponsored HAM class opened up, I enrolled in it, and received my HAM license in early 2012.

My first "rig", as it's often called, consisted of a little Yaesu 2 meter handheld connected to a magnetic-mount antenna. With this setup, I commenced "scrolling" through the various frequencies on the 2 meter band, listening to conversation, and trying to just figure out what this HAM radio was all about. As I grew bolder, I would occasionally break into a conversation, introduce myself, and maybe ask a question or two. In my entire first year, I did much more listening than talking, believe me.

One Sunday morning in early 2013, I was once again scrolling through frequencies and I happened upon the 7:00 am Road Runner Net, hosted by none other than WA7FBN, Duff. I checked in on the net, introduced myself, and exchanged a few remarks/pleasantries with Duff. Little did I realize that a total transformation of my life was soon to take place.

I checked in with Duff the next Sunday, and the next, and the next. Each time we had some brief conversation, most of a humorous whimsical tone. One morning Duff asked me if I might be interested in doing net control work for KBARA. I could scarcely believe it, considering my utter and total inexperience and newness to the whole HAM radio field. I said yes, albeit a bit reluctantly.

What I didn't know at the time was this: KBARA was experiencing a critical, almost

Desperate shortage of experienced net controllers. Duff and others (KD7AAT — "Johnboy", among them) were scrambling around trying to scrounge up a few more net controllers. Duff's offer to me was probably prompted by desperation more than anything else — he must have seen or sensed something in me that convinced him I just might make a decent net controller.

I did my first morning (7-8 am) net and it was a great success. Once, in those early days, I did the morning net three times inside of a week, which was only another indicator of just how "desperate" the net controller shortage had become. Well, things eventually stabilized, and I emerged as the permanent Thursday morning net controller for the 7-8 am morning KBARA net. I am now well into my 6th year as one of KBARA's net controllers.

I tell this story only in the hope it might be inspiration to those of you out there who might also one day be asked if you might be interested in becoming a KBARA net controller. For me, it has been a journey into the mainstream of life unlike any other I'd ever experienced previously. To be in charge, in control, to be at the very center of things to be the one responsible, to maintain and carry out interesting and intelligent conversation with people — it has been not only intensely satisfying, but also superb training for something else that may come along in the future — who knows what? To be able to state on your HAM resume that you were a KBARA net controller for maybe two years, one year or even six months is a HAM radio credential that is absolutely second to none. If, one day, you are given the chance to become a KBA-RA net controller, consider it carefully. It could well be your proverbial "opportunity of a lifetime."

Should you find yourself a net controller one day, remember that <u>you</u> are the one responsible, and will so be held, for an inappropriate activity over your net, and that's only as it should be. When you do your net, steer away from politics, religion, sexuality, or anything of that sort. Oh, I suppose you may inadvertently brush with then from time to time, but keep it at a barest minimum. If things start to get out of hand, squelch it mercilessly — you're running a KBARA net, not the Rush Limbaugh show. Above all, stay away from foul language, off-color jokes, and such things. Keep it all wholesome and appropriate, if at all possible. Never forget — <u>you</u> are in complete and total charge.

What do you suppose would be considered a net controllers greatest asset from the standpoint of personal attributes — charm, style, charisma maybe? Such things do, I suppose, all have their places in the scheme of things, I'm still trying to improve my net control "style" after nearly six years. But they are not the net controller's greatest asset(s). Want to know what is? Well, it can be summed up in a single word: <u>DEPENDABILITY!</u> Is he/she always there at the assigned time and place, ready to do the net. Controllers who might otherwise score very high on such things as charm, style, charisma, fail dismally because of simple unreliability. Is the controller going to be there when it's time — in the end it all boils down to that.

As the Thursday morning KBARA net controller, I have lasted nearly six years simply because I resolved that, no mater what problems the KBARA managers were having to deal with, who was to do the Thursday morning net would never be on of them.

Afterthought: Why do we so faithfully have these KBARA nets every morning between 7-8 am:

Answer: We are simply maintaining a viable "net" that will be ready to swing into action one day when that catastrophe or emergency strikes us.

147.360 - We installed the new ICOM FR5000 repeater along with new feedline and antenna last summer. Things seem to be working well, however I still need to get back up there and do a little bit of grounding work. I do notice a little bit of intermod from time to time, and I believe that it's coming from the radio station a couple hundred yards from the repeater site. It only happens once in a while, but have

been monitoring it to see if it gets worse.

145.190 - Link seems to have gone down for the most part. I believe that the harsh winter may have broken the yagi antenna or in the best case scenario, snow or ice may have moved or bent the antenna so it' not pointing towards Stensgar anymore. We (the club) still have the replacement antenna for the repeater frequency, and I will be looking to replace or fix the link antenna. I have been in contact with Tom Tabbert who's a weekend resident of Elk River and we are going to plan on getting to the top of the mountain soon. He is going to take ORV's up to the top and check out the road and snow for us possibly this weekend and give me a report on the conditions.

Even though there is a really strong signal from Mica which I can pickup from my house. When I open the squelch at the Lookout site I can pickup a weak signal from Mica. I discovered that the plastic covering on the coax at Lookout has wore off in three places. I don't know if that is the problem and why Mica peak is not being received. That is going to be replace regardless. If that does not work we will have to investigate Mica. Walla Walla 147.280 has reports of a weakened signal but I'm picking it up at my house so I'm not sure if it's a problem or not, it's adequate enough for people to get into the system from that repeater, so I don't suspect a problem there. Elk Butte 145.190. There will be a new antenna installed as soon as Glen, K1RR can make the trip. Stensgar 147.360. We have installed a new repeater, coax and antenna. At some point we discovered water in the coax and replaced it.




